

Focus Area Details 2023 - 2025

General Assembly: The legislative branch of the commonwealth is called the General Assembly and has a total of 253 members. It is made up of two chambers: the House of Representatives with 203 members and the Senate with 50 members. The 2020 U.S. Census put the **population of Pennsylvania at 13,002,700.** We have three state representatives in our focus area. Cumberland County has a total of five state representatives. Each

representative's district on average has a population somewhere between 64,000 to 66,000 people.

- We have one state senator for our focus area. Cumberland County has a total of two. Statewide there are 50 state senators. Each senator's district is somewhere between a population of 260,000 to 267,000 people.
- U.S Congress: The federal legislative branch of the U.S. government is called Congress. Congress has two parts, the Senate and the House of Representatives. There are 535 total members of the U.S. Congress. For the U.S. House of Representatives there are 435 and they are typically referred to as congressman/woman. The 2020 U.S. Census put the United States population at 331,449,281 people. Each member of the House of Representatives in Pennsylvania will represent an average of 764,865 people based on the 2020 Census. Cumberland County has a total of two congressmen. The state of Pennsylvania has a total of 17 congressmen.
- The U.S. Senate has two senators from each of the 50 states bringing the total to 100 U.S. Senators.

Focus Area Details 2023 – 2025

The Western Cumberland County, Pennsylvania Republican Club (WCCRC) focuses on the western part of the county. The 2020 U.S. Census population for the county was 259,469 people. Our focus area represents 37 percent of the county's total population with a population of 95,424.

• The WCCRC Focus Area consists of the 15 townships of Cooke, Dickinson, Hopewell, Lower Frankford, Lower Mifflin, North Middleton,

North Newton, Penn, Shippensburg, South Newton, Southampton, South Middleton, Upper Frankford, Upper Mifflin, and West Pennsboro. These townships encompass a total of 29 voting precincts.

- WCCRC also has the five boroughs of Carlisle, Mt. Holly Springs, Newburg, Newville, and Shippensburg (Cumberland County Portion). This brings the combined total of municipalities (townships and boroughs) in our focus area to 20 of the 33 in Cumberland County. There are 15 voting precincts with these five boroughs.
- There are 118 voting precincts in Cumberland County and our focus area has 44 of them.
- We are served by the four public school districts of Big Spring, Carlisle, Shippensburg, and South Middleton of the nine public school districts in the county. If you add the Capital Area Intermediate Area (CAIU) located in East Pennsboro Township, Cumberland County that serves several counties in the Capital Region, it brings the total to 10. <u>https://www.caiu.org/about-us/about-caiu/caiu-member-districts</u>
